Make New Year's Reservations Early

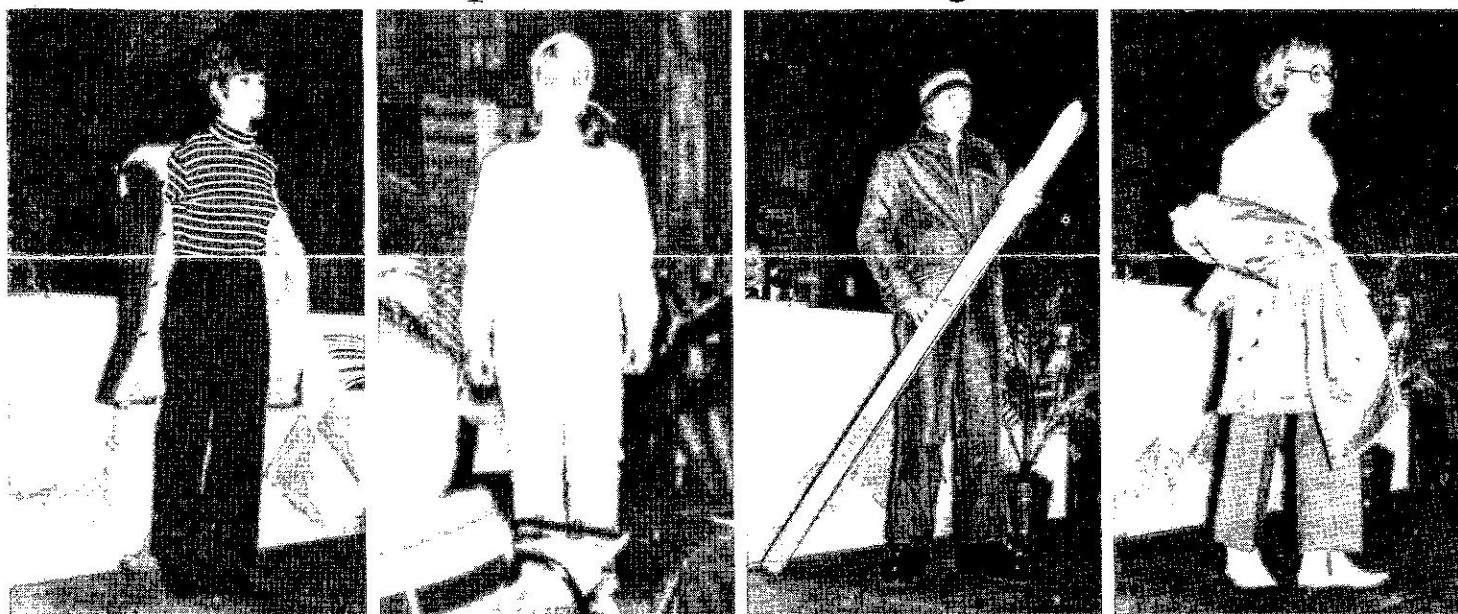

More Space Added To Air-Park Hangar

Construction is under way to add 5,200 square feet of floor space to the main hangar at Indian Lake Air-Park. When completed, the building will have a total of 11,500 square feet and will be large enough to allow for servicing five airplanes at one time.

The project is part of an overall program to expand the aircraft maintenance department to meet the increased air traffic at Indian Lake, and to set up the department to conform with standards of the Federal Aviation Administration. Indian Lake's flight training school is approved by the FAA and the aircraft maintenance department is headed by a licensed FAA mechanic and inspector.

With these high quality facilities and services, including the recently expanded air charter service, Indian Lake is now considered to be the finest small aviation center in Pennsylvania.

Work on expanding the main hangar is expected to be completed by the end of November.

Charter Flight Service Expanded

Charter flight service by Indian Lake

225 mph. This big bird together with

at 130 and 180 mph, respectively, make
up a good fleet of airplanes ready
to fly anywhere anytime — even on
short notice.
